Well what a great start to the season for all our teams. Our **U8 & U9's** are loving the opportunity to get out on the field and just play footy. Their training sessions have been first class with all coaches and assistants very impressed with the boys' efforts and smiles at training and on game day (Parents are enjoying it just as much!).

Our **U10's** have been adjusting to the new game conditions (now playing 18 per side and a full field) and again, coaches are impressed with how the boys are preparing themselves for training and game day. New players seem to be adjusting well and have been made feel very welcome. I'm told there are a few future rising stars amongst this group!

Our **U11 & 12**'s have found that as they rise through the age groups it becomes a little bit more serious and these lads have all risen to the challenge. New game plans have been implemented. Coaches have noticed many improvements and are impressed with how well they are adapting. The results have been varied but the focus and dedication to get the best out of themselves have been fantastic to watch.

The U13 & 14's have had a challenging start with both age groups running three teams, each in different divisions.

These two age groups have graded their teams with team balance being one of the priorities so it's still a work in progress as new team mates connect. With two more grading matches to play, there's an opportunity to cement themselves in their respective divisions. Ryan has set them all challenges both in preparation and how they play on game day. There are a few Ashy representatives in YJFL squads as well. An impressive start!

The **Colts** have had their challenges with new coaches and players so they too are a work in progress but the boys are keen to impress. The Colts are also running the "rostering off" policy with nearly 30 boys per team. Once the grading games are finished the boys will be able to settle in their divisions and from all reports are working well with Brett, Ben and Simon. It's a tough gig trying to juggle school sport, rep footy and Ashy Redbacks footy but the boys are up for the challenge. A successful year of footy is to come.
